



Systems of Segregation Affecting Palestinians

A seminar by Lawyers for Palestinian Human Rights

Tuesday 20th March 2012: 7.00pm – 8.30pm

This event will discuss the systems of segregation affecting the Palestinian people, particularly those in Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT), and how these systems constitute an apartheid regime.

Dr Micheal Kearney will discuss the concept of apartheid in international law and how apartheid has previously been discussed in the context of Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territories (OPT). Ben White will give examples of the various systems of segregation that operate in Israel and the OPT and how Palestinians are affected by them.

Ehab Abu Ghosh will then discuss in detail laws enacted by the Knesset that prevent Palestinians from within the OPT living with their Palestinian spouses who are Israeli citizens. Victor Kattan will close the discussion by discussing the findings of 2011 Cape Town Russell Tribunal on Palestine, which concluded that Israel does practice an apartheid regime against Palestinians.
